

**REGULAR MEETING OF THE  
HUNTINGTON COUNTY SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT DISTRICT BOARD  
February 9, 2026**

The Huntington County Solid Waste Management District Board met with Rob Miller, Terry Stoffel, County Commissioner, and Tom Wall, County Commissioners; Brian Warpup, County Council appointment representative; Richard Strick, Mayor of the City of Huntington and PJ Felton, City Council appointment. Also present for the meeting: Director, Scott Husband; Christi McElhaney, Controller; Alan Bowers, and Ardella Moriarity, Citizen Advisory Committee Members.

President Rob Miller called the meeting to order. Roll call was taken.

Christi presented the Minutes from January 12, 2026 meeting for approval. Tom Wall made a motion to approve the minutes. PJ Felton seconded the motion. Motion passed 6-0. Minutes were signed.

Christi presented the Claims and Allowances Docket, from February 9, 2026, totaling \$24,934.35. Brian Warpup made a motion to approve the claims and allowance docket. PJ Felton seconded the motion. Motion passed 6-0. Claims and Allowance docket signed.

Christi presented February 9, 2026, payroll voucher, totaling \$6,312.70. Terry Stoffel made a motion to approve the payroll docket. Richard Strick seconded the motion. Motion passed 6-0. Payroll voucher signed.

Christi presented the January 2026 financials \$431,550.95. Brian Warpup moved to approve the financials. PJ Felton seconded the motion. Motion passed 6-0. Financials signed.

Director report: Scott reported the January GFL recycling numbers were down a little due to the cold weather we assume. Scott went to Huntington North high school in Mrs. Mickley Earth Science class for education. She appreciated his presentation and would like to continue to use the materials in the future. He plans to be in Roanoke school on Earth Day again this year. He continues to work with the vocational tech school with tire changing. Rob asked if Scott would keep in mind setting up a booth at the 4H fair this year. Scott will again set out recycle bins and bags.

Scott is posting new items to Facebook and trying to get more followers. He will schedule a roadside clean-up in the spring.

New employee, Dylan Wynkoop started this past week. He is stationed at the West Park facility and helps at the Landfill facility on Wednesdays.

Scott checked with Warren Town Clerk to see if anyone has shown interest in serving on the Board as the Town Representative. He will follow up again.

Old Business: The Board is looking at the facility on Market Street, and they are waiting on two appraisals from Matt Capozza and Joel Buzzard. Scott looked into zoning with Community Development. They explained to him that the fence is on the lot line, so if it were to need replaced, it would need moved to meet set backs. He looked into the cost of

a bailer at \$4400 to \$4600 for a used one. Tom Wall would like Scott to plot out the lay out of the site and check with Community Development to see if it would be in ADA compliance. Before purchasing we would seek a Phase 1 clean up from EPA.

New Business: Christi presented the 2026-1 Salary Ordinance for approval. Tom Wall made a motion to approve the salary ordinance. Richard Strick seconded the motion. Motion passed 6-0. Ordinance signed.

Citizens Advisory Committee: Alan Bowers took Ardella Moriarity to the Solid Waste facility at the Landfill. She appreciated the tour. Scott showed Alan what he has been posting to Facebook. Ardella had some suggestions to advertise recycling to get the word out to more people. She appreciated the Facebook posts and she suggested the YMCA might be a good place. They have banners in the gym and TV monitors in the workout room, or maybe a billboard around town.

Tom Wall made a motion to adjourn. Richard Strick seconded the motion. The meeting adjourned at 8:30 a.m.
