HUNTINGTON COUNTY AWARDED \$1,365,897.40 IN COMMUNITY CROSSINGS GRANTS

HUNTINGTON, Ind. (April 12, 2024) – Huntington County has been awarded Community Crossings Grants for several roads within Huntington County.

The projects include a 1.5" mill and resurface on CR 408W from 100N to the Cul-de-sac, a 1.5" mill and resurface on several roads in Majenica being CR 412S, CR 101W, CR 405S, CR006 W. The projects also includes a 2" mill and surface on County Road 200N from Etna Avenue to the City Limits, a 1.5" mill and resurface on Broadway from US 24 to CR 600N, a 1.5" mill and resurface on Taylor Street from Broadway to Meridian Road, a 2" overlay on CR600N from SR9 to CR300W and lastly a full depth reclomation on CR 1200S from SR9 to CR800W.

With our match of \$341,474.40 added to the grant of \$1,365,897.90 means that there will be a total of \$1,707,372.30 of asphalt paving within the County.
